My Lord

I have the honor to acquaint Your Lordship that His Royal Highness Prince Arthur accompanied by Major Elphinstone, the Rev. Mr. Jelleg and Dr. Jackson arrived at Jerusalem on the 23rd of March.

I had previously deemed it my duty to proceed to Jaffa to meet the Prince, and attended His Royal Highness to Jerusalem. Subsequently, in accordance with a wish expressed by Major Elphinstone, I had the further honor of attending the Prince on the journey from Jerusalem to the Dead Sea -

the Jordan, Jericho and Bethel, where
the Royal Highness presented his
journey to have by way of Haleb,
Sidon and Haifa, myself
returning to Jerusalem. I am
happy to be able to state that
as far as the Royal Highness's journey
had progressed as successfully and
under circumstances as favorable
as could be desired.

Izzet Pasha, the governor
of Jerusalem, and the Turkish
authorities generally, received the
Royal Highness with every mark
of respect and attention consistent
with the private and quiet
character of the Prince's visit. He,
however, who had the privilege of
coming in contact with His
Royal Highness were charmed
with

with his affability, kindness and
generosity.
