I have the honour to report
that last week the French Mediterranean
Squadron, consisting of the ironclads:
"Saignelay", "Courbet", "Sevastation" and
"Amiral Baudin", and the Gun-boat
"Condor", under the Command of
Rear-Admiral Alquier, arrived
off Jaffa. On the following day
the Admiral, accompanied by a
large number of Officers, Marines
and seamen, visited Jerusalem
