I have the honour to inform Your Excellency that the Greek Patriarchate of Jerusalem is still vacant, although eleven months have elapsed since the demise of the Patriarch Hierotheos.

The rival and conflicting interests engaged in this matter have been the cause of the delay in electing a successor. The members of the local Greek Holy Synod are not agreed among themselves, swayed by personal aspirations to the office, while Turkey, Russia, and Greece have each their own candidate. An election was, indeed, made

made in October last, but the ecclesiastic selected was disqualified by his youth, nationality, and inadequate rank in the ecclesiastical hierarchy. It is a *sine qua non* that the Patriarch should be an Ottoman subject, whereas the person in question is of Hellenic origin.

In consequence of the decided opposition both of the Turkish Government and the Greek lay population, this election was annulled.

Doubtless as the result of the various manoeuvres prompted by the conflict of interests above specified, the question has remained in abeyance till recently, when orders were received from the Porte that the Synod should proceed to a new election. Accordingly, the members are being now convoked from different parts of the country for the purpose

purpose.

The Candidate favoured by the Turkish Authorities is Mgr. Agapios, Greek Bishop of Acre; the Archimandrite Nicodemos, delegate of the Greek Patriarchate at Moscow, is the person desired by Russia, while Bishop Gerasimos, delegate at Constantinople, is the Greek nominee. The Russian Consul General at Jerusalem is exerting all his authority and influence both with clergy and laity to secure the election of Mgr. Nicodemos. The power of Russia to influence the election is further strengthened by its control over certain revenues accruing to the Patriarchate from that country.
