I have the honor to report that the Austrian Consul of Jerusalem, Count Pizzamano, has been summoned to Constantinople to confer with H. E. the Intermuncio on certain points still undetermined respecting the edifice, and the ceremonies of the Church of the Holy Sepulchre.

During the past week, a bronze statue of the Empress Helena, in colossal size, has been erected, within the general edifice of the Holy Sepulchre Church, on the site of the finding of the Cross.

This statue together with some rich Church furniture is a present from the Archduke Maximilian, whose Secretary has been here for some time past, to superintend the reception and placing of the presents.

The elation of the Austrians is very great on this occasion, in addition to their satisfaction at the visible

progress being made in their noble Hospice. The depression of the French Consulate and party, is in the same proportion.

Count Pizzarano told me that he intends to request from Prince Schwartzenberg, permission to be merely left alone in humbling the fantasia of "these said gentlemen" the French - His plan being - 1st To take advantage of the different nationalities within the Convents, when all may be found except French - 2nd To take advantage of the terms of certain old Treaties which accord to Austria the

very same titles of Protector of
 Christianity, as the French adopt
 with so much parade - yet to do
 this without attacking the French
 Treaties in direct front opposition.

The Spanish Consul General has

 visit Constantinople before returning
 to Jerusalem.
