I have heard that the Pasha was instructed to give him a great demonstration of honor on his departure by a salute from the Castle guns - this however seems incredible.

The departure however is postponed for the present, while the city is so much occupied by Armenian pilgrims: a rough hardy race, ready for mischief.

The Patriarch's personal character is noted for extreme parsimony, and a determined hostility to the

improvement of his people, by education or otherwise
