of Petra, with the Dragomans who
conduct travellers by contract.

The hostilities between the Bedaween
and the Fellabheen are limited to
the direction between Egypt and Petra.
- but from this Jerusalem side some
parties have been thither of late
and returned in safety.

Excursions to the East of Jordan
are for the present quite cut off -
the Adware Arabs having been
driven from their territory of Arrman
and Serakh, by an overwhelming
invasion of the Beni Sukh'r -

I have heard nothing of late
from the district of Tiberias.
