With reference to my telegram of yesterday's date, I have the honour to report to Your Excellency that forty one Armenians who had been undergoing imprisonment at Acre for various political offences, and who were included in the recent general amnesty granted by the Sultan to Armenian prisoners,

arrived here on the 30<sup>th</sup> ultimo on  
a visit to this city before proceeding  
to their own country. I understand  
that forty two were actually liberated,  
but that on coming out of jail at  
Acre one of them had an altercation  
with and assaulted a police official,  
and was condemned to another  
eight days' imprisonment. Eight  
others are still detained in prison  
at Acre for criminal offences.

These Armenians were lodged  
in the Armenian Patriarchate in

this

this city during their stay here and  
left this morning for Jaffa in order  
to embark tomorrow on the Austrian  
steamer sailing north for the  
ports in Asia Minor and Constantinople.
