Sir,

I have the honor to lay before
Your Excellency copies of my Despatches
Nos 28, 29, 31, 32. addressed to Colonel Ross
on the subject of the French Consul the
Comte de Sautigny's arrival here, and of
his having attempted to hoist the French
Colours on his house, but which the Mus-
-ulman Inhabitants have so violently
opposed as to compell him to refrain from
a second attempt.

Up to the present hour I have nothing
further to add on this delicate subject.
The City is tranquil, but I regret to say
that the effect of the French Consul's pro-
ceedings is evident in the general bearing
of the Moslem Inhabitants.
