

Leaving from the immediate
vicinity of the Church of the Holy
Sepulchre.

These nuisances have been repeatedly
mentioned in books of travels, and
have been topics on which other
Consuls and myself remonstrated
with each successive Pasha - but
always without effect for want
of bribes large enough.

They have been now removed
to the exterior of the city, without
notice given even to those who
were to benefit by the change.

The old fashioned Moslems express

their dissatisfaction at the measure
- but the evils can never be brought
back again.

I hope to mention to His Excellency
tomorrow, another nuisance of
Jerusalem, requiring similar treatment
- and one at Jaffa -
